This workshop was held at school last week for Year 5 and 6 girls. Today we received the evaluations the girls wrote which were just incredible! Obviously the girls found the discussions so helpful and enjoyable and exactly what they need. There were three sessions on the day covering self-esteem, friendship and body image. The presenter was wonderful. My sincere thanks to Mel Shoesmith for her coordination of this event and to the P and C for their support.

Planning for 2014

Staff members are currently involved in reviewing all the information we have about how our school is going. We look at all sorts of data including reading levels, Naplan results, spelling ages etc as well as information from the surveys we have conducted. This helps us decide what we need to continue next year and what we might need to change or stop doing altogether.

At the moment one area we are looking at is Spelling. We have Spelling test scores for all grades as well as information about the children's attitude to spelling.

We asked students in Years 3-6: Do you like spelling? Are you good at spelling? Have you improved this year?

We are also spending time talking with teachers about how they teach spelling and what resources they use. This information will help us decide what we need to do in 2014.

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What is the Mid North Coast Family Referral Service?

The Family Referral Service (FRS) is an early intervention service for families in the Mid North Coast.

The role of the FRS is to assist vulnerable children, young people and families who do not meet the statutory threshold of "risk of significant harm" to access specific and appropriate support services in their local area.

The intent is to prevent a difficult situation that a family, young person or child may be experiencing from escalating to a crisis requiring a statutory response from the child protection system.





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What services does the Mid North Coast Family Referral Service provide?

The FRS provides services to both the agencies supporting families in need, and directly to the families. The FRS will:

- facilitate and improve access to services for vulnerable and disadvantaged children and families by providing appropriate information, support and advocacy
- · provide telephone and face-to-face services
- provide referrals to Indigenous specific services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and families where appropriate and possible
- provide feedback pathways for callers and services as part of quality improvement processes at both a service and system level
- work towards developing a stronger regional network of non-government, government and individual service providers who can meet the needs of families.

How the service works

Straightforward referrals are managed by the telephone service. More complex referrals (eg. where there are complex or multiple support needs, or a family has entered and exited services multiple times) are followed up by our outreach workers.

FRS outreach workers are based in Kempsey and Taree, and are available for face-to-face appointments in the community. They work closely with families to support them accessing services for up to six weeks.



Evaluating our service

Evaluation is an important part of our service. We will be seeking feedback from those who utilise our services as to whether our referrals have been successful or if further support is needed.
