





Come On Down and Join in the Water Fun

The club will commence Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate courses on Sunday 22nd September in the clubhouse at 11am.

Bronze Medallion Candidates are required to be 15 years of age before the end of December 2019, be a member of the club and have completed a 400m timed pool swim in under 9 minutes. Evidence is required.

Surf Rescue certificate Candidates are required to be 13 years of age before the end of December 2019; be club member (nipper or active) and have completed a 200m timed pool swim in under 5 minutes. Evidence is required.

These two awards are part of the pathway towards Certificate 11 Public Safety, Aquatic Rescue. They are the entry-level courses for paid lifeguards and all volunteer patrolling lifesavers. Including those wishing to support Nippers in the water on Sundays. Adults can do the SRC and still do water safety, you do not have to do the Bronze medallion to support nippers in the water and or do patrols.

If you are interested in gaining these awards and joining in the fun on the beach, patrols, supporting nippers, getting fit, competition and/or social events that the club holds.

Dear Parents and Carers

For the next 5 weeks our school will be taking part in *Partners in Learning* parent survey which is part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys on student engagement. The parent survey helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parent and school. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed on-line and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar**, which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will <u>not</u> be able to identify individual responses. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

The survey takes around 15 minutes to complete. Parents with more than one child at the school may choose to complete the survey more than once, if they feel that their children's experiences differ. Schools are provided with a unique URL which they provide to parents to log into the survey. If you do not have access to a computer a home we can organise for you to complete the survey at school.

Examples of outdoor use include:

- Boat motor flushing: on a lawn area if possible.
 Topping up of pools.
 Cleaning driveways, paved areas, windows, walls and roofs: buckets only.

month (the 2nd, 4th, 6th etc). If your house in an odd number, then you can water on the odd days of the month, (the 1st, 3rd, 5th etc). There is no residential outside water use on the 31st of the month.

Public Areas

Parks, gardens and non-active playing surfaces:

A 30% reduction on regular use is required, with users to develop a water management plan to achieve this

Active playing areas: A 30% reduction on regular use is required, with users to develop a water management plan to achieve this target.

Bowling greens and golf courses: Irrigation systems and hand held hoses for one hour per day on greens only (MidCoast Council will work with operators to develop management plans for use).

Garden ponds: Topping up by hand held hoses only.

Fountains: Total ban.

Commercial and Industrial

Nurseries and market gardens: Sprinklers and fixed hoses can be used before 9am and after 4pm. Hand held

with a bucket and trigger hose rinse.

Construction industry: Hoses used must be fitted with a hand-held trigger to shut off flow when released.





- · Applying for births, deaths and marriages certificates
- Applications and Renewals for Working with Children Checks
- Consulting with a Cost of Living specialist for help accessing more than 40 government rebates and savings.

Mobile Service Centres will accept cashless payments by credit and debit card or cheque.
