


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#### **MY COMMUNITY PROJECT**

#### New Playground

We are very excited to announce that we have an installation date for our new playground. Last year our P&C secured a place in the voting for the My Community Project. We were successful in winning a grant for \$79,500 and we have used saved school funds to contribute \$28,457 for a total project cost of \$107,957. During the first week of the holidays the current playground will be removed and the new one installed. During the second week, the rubber base will be completed. We now have 3D designs of how it will look. Very exciting!

#### **Canberra Excursion**

The last few months have been challenging for many of us and filled with great uncertainty. The government is gradually lifting restrictions but when life will return to "normal" is still unclear. It is a particularly challenging time for our Year 6 students who are in their final year of primary school. Following recent Department advice all excursions are still on hold and it is unclear when

travel will be permitted. So it is with great sadness and reluctance that we have made the decision to cancel the early Term 4 excursion to Canberra. Our number 1 priority is student safety and as always we need to adhere to Department guidelines. We hope that you understand that this decision was not made lightly. Any money that has been paid can be redirected to school fees or our Year 6 Graduation or for Year 5 students funds can be held over to 2021. Refunds via direct deposit can also be issued.



#### Voluntary Contribution Fee and Resource Levy

Thank you to those parents who have paid their 2020 Resource Levy and Voluntary Contribution fees. Updated statements were sent home again last week. #### **Head Lice**


We ask that all children tie their hair back when they come to school please. Please check your child's hair tonight for nits/lice and if you find any nits or lice commence treatment as recommended.

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#### **INFORMATION FOR OUR PARENTS**

#### Inclusive Education Statement for Students with Disability

The NSW Department of Education has released an *Inclusive Education Statement for Students with Disability*. This is the next step in the Department's Disability Strategy commitment to improve learning and wellbeing for students with disability in every public school. The Disability Strategy was released in February 2019, and sets out the Department's plan for providing children and



young people with disability, their families and the broader community with an education system that meets their needs. The statement is about strengthening inclusive education for all students with disability in mainstream schools and their support classes, and schools for specific purposes.

#### Inclusive education

Inclusive education means all students can access and fully participate in learning, supported by reasonable adjustments and teaching strategies tailored to meet their individual needs. Inclusion should be embedded in all aspects of school life, and is supported by culture, policies and everyday practices. All NSW public schools should champion inclusive education.

#### Have your say

The Department will listen and work with students, parents and educators over 2020 on what support is needed to strengthen inclusion of students with disability. This feedback will inform an Inclusive Education Policy and practice resources.

#### **Reading at home**

Are you reading with your children at home? Are they reading to you? A few years ago, a decision was made by staff and parents to minimise the amount of homework we were expecting children to do. We looked at the amount of extracurricular activities students were involved in – sport, dance, music – and reinforced the notion that these provided rich learning outcomes and a balanced

lifestyle for students. (Research continues to reinforce the notion that homework in primary school has no positive impact on their learning outcomes.) We did however ask that parents encourage their children to read for 10 – 20 minutes each night. This was – and continues to be - the only mandatory homework we expect students to complete. During 'lock-down' in Term 2 it was evident that many students were reading for pleasure and statistics showed a pleasing increase in reading skill and confidence. Reading is the single most important skill to develop in children. Reading to and with your child daily is the greatest gift you can give your child. Keep up the great work!






