






Reminder

Staff update

As you know Tahlee Thomas has been working with us to support our Aboriginal students and engage all our students with indigenous culture. Tahlee also worked with 5/6S on Wednesdays. Tahlee has started maternity leave. We thank her for the incredible impact she has had in a short period of time and wish her and her family all the best for the newest addition to the family. She has worked closely with Katrina Punton and has been doing a wonderful job with this across the school. Kyle Baldwin will replace her working with 5/6S on Wednesdays.

Buses

Unfortunately, we have had a small number of students behaving in a disrespectful and unsafe manner on the buses to and from school. If your child catches a bus, please speak with them about travelling safely to school. We have had a number of reports from drivers about unsettled behaviours and unsafe actions. Several students have received warning letters and 20 day bans. Behaviours that cause the most concern continue to be:

- × Not wearing seat belts
- × Out of seat, changing seats, moving around the bus
- Throwing things around the bus
- Inappropriate language or offensive language
- × Not showing respect e.g. being rude to the driver and not following directions.



A COVID reminder for all families

Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms should be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

We have had a number of families from Sydney, who are currently living here, call to enrol temporarily at our school. These requests have been declined.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all teaching, SLSO and SASS staff, for your ongoing support and commitment to the children and families of PPPS.
