Aurora College is a NSW Department of Education virtual school offering Year 5 and Year 6 students "Opportunity Class" lessons in Mathematics, Science and Technology. Aurora shares students with more than 100 rural and remote government schools. Aurora students connect with their teachers and

classmates in timetabled lessons through a virtual learning environment.

This term Aurora students completed a mini project titled 'The Jiggler Challenge'. They were

tasked with inventing a device that was self-powered and able to jiggle a teabag without poor humans having to go to so much effort. The students had to define the problem and design a prototype model which underwent continuous modifications. Each student was supplied with a STEM kit to enable them to build their model.

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Information for our Parents



Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to lidentify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability. The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified - the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage



and disclosure of personal information. To find out more about these matters, please refer to the Australian Government's Privacy Policy (https://www.education.gov.au/privacy-policy).





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




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HOLIDAY PROGRAM Preparation Guide





ON-TOUR ACTIVITIES will depart at approximately 8.30am unless otherwise specified.

What to wear?

Children are encouraged to wear comfortable, weather appropriate clothing, with closed toe shoes. For water events, it's best to have children wear their bathers underneath their clothes

Safety attire

Every child is provided with a bright coloured Big Childcare vest with centre contact details attached. For water events, every child is provided with a Big Childcare rashie for protection and safety. A wristband will also be given to each child based on their water confidence level.

What to pack?

Backpack, lunch, morning and afternoon tea, water bottle, hat, sunscreen, change of clothes. For water events, bring bathers, towel, thongs/sandals, allergy-free sunscreen if required, plastic bag and change of clothes.

What NOT to pack?

We strongly encourage children to leave valuables at home as Big Childcare will not be responsible for any loss or damage. We kindly ask that you do not provide your children with spending money.

Excursion locations may be subject to change. You will be notified via email or text when this happens.

SUPER INCURSIONS AND HOME-BASED ACTIVITIES:

You can arrive at any time within our opening hours during a Home Base day, or before a Super Incursion activity begins. Super Incursions are hosted by an external group, or involve resources booked for a specific experience. Themes can range from Build a Bear, Petting Zoo, Mobile Arcade, Cooking Class, Colour Run etc.. You will be updated on any special items to bring on these days. Home Base days are hosted by the centre and include a variety of fun themes of current interest to children. There is no additional cost on a Home Base day

BOOKING CHANGES

Changes

If making a change to your booking you will need to do this by Friday 1 July 2022.

Cancellations are not permitted during school holiday program. Amendments to bookings will need to be made prior to the holiday program starting.

No cancellations or refunds are permitted during holiday care as staff, resources and/or venues and transportation have been secured based on your confirmed booking

HEALTH & SAFETY

Medical Plan

If your child has a medical condition, you will need to provide medication(s) along with the relevant completed action plan before your child can attend. Medication must be in the original packaging, clearly labelled with the child's name. The packaging must also clearly state the dosage and be within the expiry date. Additionally, you must complete a medication consent form filled out at your centre. Please note that without clearly labelled medication and consent form, children will be unable to attend the holiday program. Please allow time to process this when enrolling and booking
