



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PRINCIPAL NEWS

Bus Behaviour

Unfortunately, we have had a small number of students behaving in a disrespectful and unsafe manner on the buses to and from school. If your child catches a bus, please speak with them about travelling safely to school. We have had a number of reports from drivers about unsettled behaviours and unsafe actions. Several students have received a warning letter or a 2-week suspension. Behaviours that cause the most concern continue to be:







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- · Not wearing seat belts
- · Out of seat, changing seats, moving around the bus
- · Throwing things around the bus
- · Inappropriate language or offensive language
- · Not showing respect eq. being rude to the driver and not following directions.

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


Kindergarten 2023 Information Night

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






8-10 year olds – we need you!
